

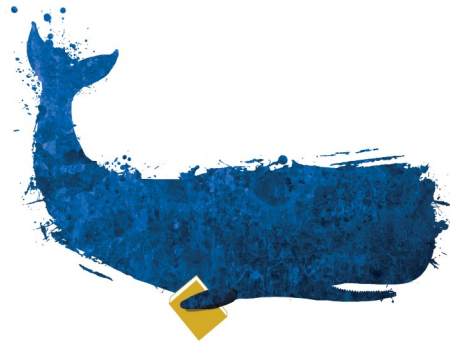
Teen Programs

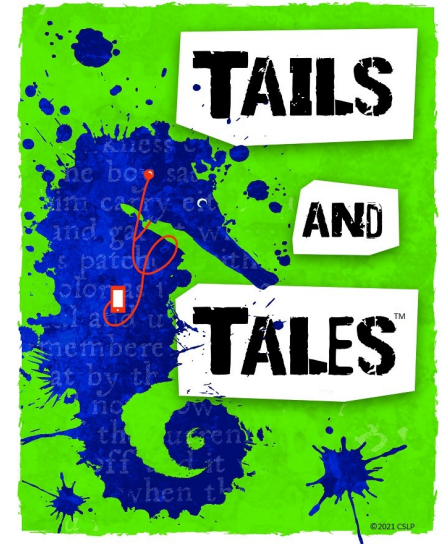
